

#### **Iron Jawed Angels**


This tells the story of Alice Paul and Lucy Burns who fought for the passage of the 19th Amendment, giving American women the right to vote.

# Teen Area at Guildford Library





## **CUPE 402 Scholarships**



The deadline is fast approaching to apply for the CUPE 402 Scholarships. No applications will be accepted after June 30, 2015 so if you or your dependant qualifies make sure to get the application in to the 402 Office as soon as possible.

There are two types of Scholarship applications available, one for dependants of CUPE members and the other is for CUPE Members. The dependants of CUPE members must be graduating from Grade 12 in the current or previous year and attending a Post-Secondary Institution for full time studies. The CUPE member must be attending a post-secondary institution or pursuant of part-time studies.

The Scholarship applications are available to all CUPE members of Locals 402, 402-01,402-02 & 402-03. The CUPE member must be in good standing and have attended a minimum of two (2) General Membership meetings from September to May.

Closing date of applications is June 30<sup>th</sup> and then a copy of Registration and payment for post-secondary institution must be submitted to the Union Office by September 15<sup>th</sup>. For Dependants a copy of final transcript and Provincial grades should also be submitted to the Union Office by September 15<sup>th</sup>. Scholarships are normally awarded at the October 402 General Membership Meeting.
