

Union Meetings: What are they?

Have you ever been to a Union Meeting? What do we really interesting discusdo at them, anyways?

Union meetings are a confidential space for our members to come together (without management) to discuss news, updates, and to bring up questions or concerns we have about our jobs and working environments.

If you've never been to one, they can seem a bit overwhelming. There's a lot of jargon. However, we're happy to help you understand what's going on!

We discuss things in sections. (There are always meeting minutes provided, so you can follow along.) People can join in and ask questions at any point, and sometimes there are some sions!

Some of the things you'll see discussed are:

Old Business: things from the last meeting that are still being talked about. Maybe it's a health and safety is-

New Business: new things that are coming up that might affect our job or our pay.

Labour Management Report: this is a report from meetings between management and the union, and it's a good way to know what the union is bringing forward on our behalf, and what management's responses are.

Library Board Reports: what do they discuss at their meetings? We send a Union rep to each meeting, and they write a report to share with us.

There are a lot of other things we talk about, but we go through them fairly quickly (we don't want to keep you up too late!)

The meetings are a nice way to see other faces from across Surrey Libraries, and there are prize draws at each meeting, so you might even win something!

...and snacks. We always have food at the in-person ones.:)

PIC (Person in Charge)

Let's talk about PIC! Here are some questions (and answers) to keep in mind if you get asked to be PIC.

Do I earn more money? Yes, you earn \$2.00 more per hour that you are PIC.

Do I have to accept? PIC is to be used when there is no LIC (Librarian in Charge) available, and for short periods. If you are asked to be PIC for a period of over 2 hours, and if you feel uncomfortable accepting the role of PIC for any reason, you are under no obligation to accept.

What do I do if I'm asked?

Something to keep in mind if you're asked to be PIC is to check to make sure you're the only option. PIC is supposed to be used as a last resort, so you are within vour rights to ask if there are no on-call librarians who could be contacted first. You can also check with a librarian in the branch, who can check the schedule for

What if I don't mind accepting a PIC shift, but I don't feel properly trained?

Please let your managers know that you don't feel ready, or that you'd like proper training. You can also ask your supervisors or other regular staff you feel comfortable with to pass along your feedback.

Is it okay that I found out I was PIC after my shift started?

You should always be asked first. If you arrive to a shift and find out you have been scheduled as PIC without your consent, let your Union know.

How does the seniority work?

It should be: Librarian, Circulation Supervisor, staff member with the highest seniority.

Don't forget to check your payroll after accepting a PIC shift to make sure you've been paid properly.

Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Snack Cake

Makes: approx. 16 Prep: 15 minutes Cook: 35-40 minutes

Ingredients:

2 large eggs
1 to 2 tsp vanilla extract
1 cup granulated sugar
1 cup all-purpose flour
1 cup pumpkin puree
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp baking soda
2 tsp pumpkin pio anice

2 tsp pumpkin pie spice ½ tsp salt

1 tsp ground cinnamon 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

Directions: (note: recipe easily doubles for 9x13 pan)

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F. Prepare an 8x8 inch baking pan and set aside.
- 2. To a large bowl, add the eggs, sugar, pumpkin, oil, pumpkin pie spice, cinnamon, vanilla, and whisk to combine.
- Add the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, and stir until just combined, don't overmix.
- 4. Add the chocolate chips and stir to combine. Turn batter out into prepared pan, smoothing the top lightly with a spatula. Bake for about 35 to 40 minutes or until center is set and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean or with a few moist crumbs, no batter.
- 5. Allow cake to cool in the pan for at least 1 hour before slicing and serving.
